FROM OUR MINISTER TO STUDENTS...

I've shared with you all before, but I am a sports fan. Particularly, I'm a fan of the St. Louis Cardinals in baseball, the San Francisco 49^{ers} in football, and the Tennessee Volunteers in college sports. But just in general, I enjoy sports. When I am allotted a lazy Sunday afternoon, I find it enjoyable to just turn on a game and zone out. Unfortunately, due to my job, my 4-year-old, and the fact that I have a wife who doesn't really enjoy sports, I don't get to do that very often. This past week, I was able to catch the last few minutes of a game. In this particular game, the Buffalo Bills were playing the Arizona Cardinals. In this game, Buffalo took a late lead and it looked like they were going to win. However, one of the most exciting plays in all sports took place with just 11 seconds left. The quarterback for Arizona threw what is known as a "Hail Mary" pass which was caught in the endzone for a touchdown. That pass won the game for the Cardinals.
