FROM OUR MINISTER TO STUDENTS...

Nostalgia is a real thing. I don't care how much someone might claim not to experience it, we all are nostalgic over something. It is defined as "a sentimental longing or wistful affection for the past."

As I've gotten older, I have seen myself become more and more nostalgic over the most random things. For example, I was eating a meal with some of our church staff recently and someone was drinking a Coca-Cola. Immediately, without thinking about it, I began singing a jingle that I hadn't heard in decades. In fact, I looked it up and it debuted in 1993 when I was 7 years old. Maybe you remember it? *"The stars will always shine; the birds will always sing. As long as there is thirst, there's always the real thing. Coca-Cola is always the one. Whenever there is fun, there's always Coca-Cola."* I was immediately transported back to sitting on the living room floor of my childhood home watching TV with my family. Moments like this become more and more prevalent in our life as we get older because there is a part of us that will always pine for the "simpler times."
