FROM OUR YOUTH PASTOR

This past weekend brought with it something many of us "Mississippians" are not too familiar with. It is beautiful to see, fun to play with, but has the capability to completely shut down our world for a time. This happens once every year or so here in Mississippi and it's something I get excited to see it show up and just as excited to see it go. This event I am speaking of is snow. On Sunday morning, I woke up around 6:00 to get ready to go to church and when I went to take the dog out, I realized I couldn't see grass in the back yard. All I could see was a white blanket. I immediately got excited. I chose to wait a few minutes before waking up my wife and daughter so they could sleep just a little longer. After waking them up, we had to go outside and play. Of course, due to road situations, we elected to postpone our Sunday gatherings for a week, and this gave my little family plenty of time to play in the snow. I would like to share two take-aways I gathered from spending time with Leia in the snow this past weekend.

First, sometimes what we want right now is not what we want in the future. As I was playing with Susanna, Leia, and Roxy (the dog) yesterday morning. Leia couldn't make up her mind as to whether she wanted to continue playing outside. You see, Leia absolutely LOVES the snow but just as much HATES the cold. We would go outside and play for 15 or so minutes then have to go inside and warm up for a while then she would want to go play again then we'd have to go inside and warm up. As I was thinking through this after helping put on her coat for about the 10th time vesterday, Psalm 37:4 came to mind. It says, "Delight yourself in the Lord, and He will give you the desires of your heart." So often in our lives, we pursue the thing of this world, the things we think we want, without pursuing God first and in that situation, when we finally gain what we want, we realize it does not fulfill us. Leia thought she wanted to play in the snow, then thought she wanted to go inside, then thought she wanted to play in the snow, then thought she wanted to go inside, and so on... Pursue God above all else and His desires will become ours.

The second life lesson from playing with Leia in the snow is God is in control. Last night, after the sun had set and it was getting close to her bedtime, she wanted to walk about outside and look at the snow. She immediately became disheartened at the fact that the snow was going away and asked if it would snow again tomorrow. I got to explain to her that God allowed it to snow today because he knew we needed it. It snowed because God told the snow to fall. Then I shared with Leia one of my favorite verses in scripture: Romans 8:28. It says, "And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose." I know Paul didn't write this about the weather, but I was able to use the snow as a conduit to telling Leia about how God is in control of all things, and if we allow Him, all things that happen will be used for our good. This is a reminder we all need to hear. Whatever the circumstances, when we surrender them to God, he WILL use them for His glory and our good.
