I've umpired baseball of all ages ranging from 7 and 8 year old coach pitch to some low-level college ball. I spend a majority of my umpiring time doing high school ball. As I sit to write this, the regular season of high school baseball ends tonight. As you read this, a majority of the local schools in our area will be competing in the state playoffs. The reason I'm writing about this today is I had a brief but interesting conversation with a player out of the Jackson area a couple weeks ago that I cannot seem to get out of my mind. I'll spare you the details of the conversation but the crux of it was that I made a call (the right call) that this player disagreed with. It indirectly resulted in him striking out just two pitches later. On his way back to the dugout after striking out, he turned, looked at me, pointed his bat at me, and says that he deserves to be on first base and it's my fault that he struck out. The last thing he said to me is what has stuck in my mind. "I deserve to be on first base. It's your fault I struck out."

While I disagree with what he said, I can understand his emotions getting the better of him in the midst of a closely played game that had playoff implications on the line. How often do we carry this attitude into our walk with Christ? "God, I deserve this (raise/promotion/good grade/healthy family member/strong marriage/whatever you want to put here)." "God, I've earned this and since I don't have what I want, it's your fault." Too often we come to God with expectations and an attitude of entitlement. An attitude of since I have been in church for 40 years and read my Bible twice a week and even give to the church every month, God owes me what I want. We need to remember that the only thing we deserve is death, Hell, and permanent separation from God. It is through his grace that we have a life of hope. Ephesians 2:8-9 says, "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast." We just finished celebrating Easter and the resurrection of Christ. I pray that the celebration we experienced just a couple days ago lasts all year in our heart and mind. Never forget, it is through Him that we have life. We don't deserve anything good, but God continues to bless us in ways the we cannot even imagine. I love you, church family, and pray for you.
