#### FROM OUR CHIEF OF STAFF ...

COMMUNICATION

I have been giving some thought of late concerning communications (and the lack thereof) in our society, and it has not been pleasant. We as a society do not do very well in clearly communicating with our fellow members of society. This has been happening for some time and affecting us all. I will describe an example below with possible applications to our church to-

THE BAYOU PROJECT

When I worked for Monsanto Company I was assigned to work on the design and construction of an ethylene plant located in Alvin, Texas. Now, ethylene plants are very interesting in that gasoline is probably the safest by-product of the plant with everything else being more dangerous and explosive. I am not aware of any ethylene plant being repaired after experiencing an incident with fire. They explode, and there is little left to repair.

A major issue with the construction project was making sure that the correct revision of the drawings were in the field. The construction work force was large and diverse with coordination of various crafts being critical. Having the foundation in the correct place for the pressure vessel containing explosive liquids is really fairly important to prevent explosions. After several early occurrences where crew # 1 was working using Rev-1 of the construction documents, and crews #3 and #4 were using Rev-3, Brown & Root supervision correctly felt that something needed to be done.

I do not remember the last name of the person who came up with the solution, but I do remember that his first name was Jim Bob. Jim Bob was 100% Texan and recommended that we color code any drawing revisions using a different color binding strip for drawings (e.g. green = rev 1, red = rev 2 ...). They also posted the current revision color in conspicuous places, and made the subject in safety meetings. By making the message simple, in

multiple locations and repetitive, Jim Bob saved the day.

I am not implying that we are a large construction project or Brown & Root, but as with any organization we can have communication problems if we are not diligent. We have several tools to help us do this, and we will be using them with your support.

- Shelby Membership App This app gives us the ability to e-mail, text or phone large segments of our congregation with information concerning upcoming events.
- HBC Connect App Upcoming events (business meetings, deacon ordination, Christmas In The Highlands ...) will be shown on the church website as well as in the HBC Connect app.
- Announcement Slide Show We display upcoming events prior to every Sunday service in the sanctuary and gathering space.
- Facebook The church has a Facebook page as do several of our
