FROM OUR MINISTER TO STUDENTS...

Pastor, author, and theologian A.W. Tozer said during his ordination, "I am Thy servant to do Thy will, and that will is sweeter to me than position or riches or fame, and I choose it above all things on Earth or in Heaven." The calling to follow God's will for our life is one that we often take seriously until it becomes difficult. Then, the tendency is to abandon this call to follow for a lesser call to pursue self-comfort. 32 years ago, there was a group of high school students that changed the world by following the will of God in their life at that exact moment. These students were participating in a Disciple Now in Burleson, Texas right outside of Fort Worth. The Saturday evening of this Disciple Now, these students became so convicted to pray for their classmates and friends, they drove to three different local schools to do just that. Because this was late in the evening on a Saturday, all the schools were obviously locked. They decided to pray for each school right in front of it beside the flagpole.

Not long after this night, word began to spread about what the students had done. They were asked to speak at a youth event a few months later and in September of 1990, See You At The Pole was born. That first year, over 45,000 students gathered to pray for their classmates, their teachers, and their school in general. Today, over 30 years later, See You At The Pole is in all 50 states and over 60 countries worldwide. On September 28 (or September 27th if you attend a Lauderdale County School) millions of students will gather together to seek after God. They will gather together to pray for their school that the lost would be saved and that the broken would be healed.

Every middle school, high school, and some elementary schools in our area will be participating. If you, or your kids/grandkids, are in school, I encourage you/them to be a part of this. Meridian public schools, Lamar School, Russell, and neighboring county schools will be participating on the actual day of See You At The Pole, which is September 28. Because of virtual learning days, See You At The Pole will be held on September 27 for all Lauderdale County Schools. You will need to check with the local FCA branches or ask the administration for the time. Most will do it before school, but some might be during morning break. God started a movement from the faithfulness of just a few high school students. That same God desires the same level of faithfulness and obedience from each of us today.
