

FROM OUR MINISTER TO STUDENTS....

I turned 15 in October of my freshman year of high school. During that time, if you had a job, there was no waiting period between getting your learner's permit and your driver's license. If you could prove that you had a job and could pass the written and driving parts of the test, you could get your license as a 15-year-old. I had a job and, therefore, got my license the day after I turned 15. I had never experienced that kind of freedom before. I no longer had to rely on my friends to give me rides home after football practice. I no longer had to wait on my dad to finish up with choir practice on Wednesday nights to go home from church. I had wheels... I was mobile... I had freedom...

With that freedom came the ability to abuse it. For the most part, I was responsible and respectful with my newfound freedom. For the most part, I didn't speed. For the most part, I was where I was supposed to be. For the most part, I didn't abuse it. However, I wasn't perfect. Periodically, I did speed. Periodically, I was late for curfew. Periodically, I wasn't where I was supposed to be. One time in particular, my sophomore year of high school, me and two friends had decided to skip our second period class and go get a late breakfast. Upon arriving back at school, we were promptly spotted by a teacher and turned in to the principal. Fortunately, we weren't suspended. However, we did receive detention and our parents were called. I knew I was in trouble. For the next several hours, I did nothing except try to figure out how to avoid what I knew was waiting for me when I got home. In spite of my best efforts, when I got home, I was grounded and had my keys taken away from me.

Looking back on that day, I would have done anything to avoid what I had coming to me. Even though I deserved it, even though it was a just punishment, I still tried everything to get out of the consequences. As I think about this story and look ahead to Easter in just a couple weeks, I'm reminded of Jesus' time of prayer just before his arrest. It's obvious that Jesus was not looking forward to his arrest, his physical abuse, his crucifixion, and everything else that was coming his way. He obviously was wanting to avoid this. However, he understood that the will of the Father superseded His own. In Matthew 26:39 it says, "And going a little farther he fell on his face and prayed, saying, 'My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as you will'." There are times we will be put into a place where we absolutely will not be looking forward to what is coming, sometimes as a result of our own actions, sometimes simply because our will differs from the will of God. However, I encourage you today and every day to remember that God's will for our lives is so much greater than our own. Even in situations that we would personally like to avoid, we must trust that God is in control and that He is better than everything this world has to offer.
