

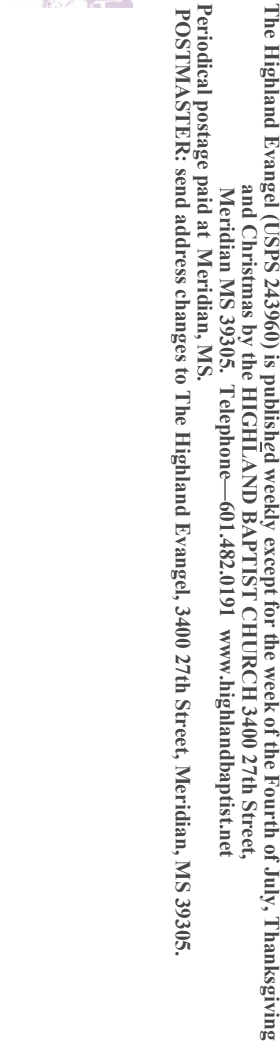

FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF CHILDREN'S MINISTRIES...

Every year I register for a ministry conference to better my work as a Director, stay up to date with curriculum and to be encouraged in the Word as well as by others in the same work. This year I was looking forward to a conference of a different kind, and it was talked of highly when I entered the ministry by other trusted leaders, so I was ready.

My sister Emmie and I headed to Atlanta, GA, and as we started the first night we were in an arena of a sold out conference with 8,000 other church leaders from all over the US. As we sat through the first two hours of the kick off, we both began to have this weird feeling. I began to think maybe this was a leadership/self help conference as opposed to a "Ministry" conference.

They all seemed to know the speakers and highly applaud these leaders. We had fun, but it all felt so "worldly" and we kept waiting for one of the many speakers to bring a Bible or maybe use some scripture ...something with Jesus in it. So we kept waiting and finally we sang Lauren Daigle's song at the end and finally got "some" Jesus.

The next day was full of break out classes so we separated, and after each class we would catch up on what we learned, but still awkward comments and not much scripture. Imagine the scene of 8,000 followers of this "movement" flocking to the scene and people were everywhere. It was a visual I will remember. At lunch we both said "something does not feel right", "something is making me uncomfortable". What is it? I mean they aren't doing anything wrong.

Following 3 days of this I was angry that I didn't get anything out of it and I only get one budgeted opportunity a year. Then we both concluded that this is exactly what the Lord wanted us to see.

It was a wake up call for us as well as a reminder to be aware of false prophets or just leaving God out, even in the world of ministry. It's not all good, so keep close with the Holy Spirit in helping you discern what is and what isn't. Like I said, they did nothing wrong, but maybe it's what they didn't do that was wrong. In everything we do put the Lord FIRST and ALWAYS use the word in your teachings. Love, Dana
