"Bridge the Gap." Those were the three words that came right out of my mouth in a meeting back in August when I shared a vision for Adopt the Heart of a CDC Family. In that meeting, I told the CDC teachers that this ministry was a way for our church to "bridge the gap" and form a prayer partnership with the families that walk through the doors each day. Highland has already started a partnership with West Hills Elementary School through the Hope Packs Ministry, and we are excited to start a Reading Ministry with the 2nd grade students soon. Will you agree to come and receive a FREE LUNCH next Thursday, October 24th, and learn more about this reading ministry? I promise that our time together will be beneficial, you'll have a chance to ask any questions, and I hope you'll prayerfully consider making the commitment to one child at West Hills. Reading for 30 minutes a week, at your convenience, is an easy way for our church to bridge the gap and continue on our path to becoming an externally focused church.
